FORD TECH SAYS AFTERMARKET IGNITION COILS ARE NO GOOD

Veteran Ford technician Brian, who runs the automotive repair YouTube channel known as Ford Tech Makuloco, makes informative videos explaining his repair processes and the reasoning behind them. In the past, he's walked viewers through a <u>starter issue diagnosis on a 2006 Ford F-150</u>, given an in-depth <u>explanation of the Ford battery monitoring system</u> on F-150s and shown his process for <u>figuring out a heater core issue</u> on another pickup. He also takes the time to explain <u>why he doesn't like to use certain parts</u>, and in a recent video, he tells viewers why he stays away from using aftermarket ignition coils.





Brian had a "comeback" 2013 Ford F-150 return to his shop after quite a bit of work, presenting with a misfire. The Ford tech carefully inspected all of his work and found that the misfire was not because of anything he had done, but rather because of the poor quality of the aftermarket ignition coils previously installed on the vehicle.

"I'm here to say stick with OEM," he says. "From the factory, [OEM coils] do not fail that often, if at all." He explains that often, customers will get frustrated while chasing a misfire, and choose to "upgrade" to aftermarket ignition coils in an attempt to remedy the situation. While aftermarket coils may solve the problem at first, they are liable to fail shortly after installation.

To prove his point, the Ford tech swaps the misfiring F-150's aftermarket coils with an old set of coils he removed from a vehicle with an EcoBoost engine at the request of a customer. Brian knew the coils were still good and hung onto them for testing purposes. Once he swaps the old FoMoCo coils into the vehicle, it runs fine.

"Avoid the marketing hype with these aftermarket ignition parts," he concludes.

To OEM or Not To OEM

The above articles addresses the age-old dilemma that owners of special interest cars or trucks routinely must deal with – whether to use OEM or aftermarket replacement parts. No matter if it is a late model car or a vintage vehicle. Sometimes there is no choice as only aftermarket parts are available. But with later model cars, such as our retro Thunderbirds, there are often options, especially regarding mechanical parts. As I write this article for the newsletter my '02 is convalescing at the local Ford dealer awaiting a fuel pump. This part is available as an aftermarket part as well as OEM. Unfortunately, the OEM version is scarce. The part is still available from Ford but currently has an unknown ETA status as it is on back order. The service supervisor contacted me and explained that they were trying to source an OEM version from another dealer but there was an aftermarket version available immediately. He advised me that he needed to make me aware of the options, but he assumed that my answer would be to await the OEM part even though it would be more expensive. He, of course, was correct. We had just had the OEM vs aftermarket discussion a few days earlier when I gave him a copy of the above article. Through the diligent effort of the dealer's parts department, they located the needed part at a small, practically obscure, Ford dealer in Texas. The service supervisor relayed several stories to me where they had to "fix" customers cars where aftermarket parts had not performed as expected. I shared this article with a longtime friend who advised me that his dealer used NAPA parts on his Honda CRV (not sure why maybe availability) only to ultimately replace the part with a genuine Honda part to fix the problem. Bottom line, there is a reason OEM parts cost more. They are designed and engineered by car company employees to effectively do the job intended. I will always go the OEM route unless there is no other option. How about you?

REMINDER: Please Send US Your VIN Number!!!!

The MATC Board of Directors continues its effort to develop a directory of VIN data (Vehicle Identification Number/ serial number) for members vehicles. If you have not submitted yours yet, please send it Skip, Cathy, Steve, or any officer. This information can be beneficial as a reference future owners when a car changes hands. New owners often inquire back to clubs like MATC to determine if the prior owner was a club member. This information can be very helpful in tracing the history of the vehicle.
