This Torch Red 2002 TBird pictured sold for an eye popping, eye watering \$41,800 (including the 10% buyer's premium: \$38,000 + \$3800) at the recent Barrett-Jackson auction. The car had 9100 miles, certainly a factor in the very healthy price. It is similar to mine, except for the Performance White hardtop and apparently it has only the partial accent interior. As a point of reference, the MSRP for mine was \$39,795. Before you get ready to put yours on eBay, or register it at Barrett-Jackson, several other 2002s with more typical mileage for this vintage retro (30 – 40K range) sold in the mid \$20K range which is still a bump (jump?) over the more typical price range for these cars. Either way, there seems to be an interest in these iconic cars. Let's hope this is not just a passing fancy. Maybe the great color is what made the difference......For more info:

About 1998 I told John I needed additional forms of transportation. Besides my Ford Explorer I needed an old pickup truck and a new sports car. Shortly later I found the truck at a yard sale, a 1985 Ford F-150 with the shift on the floor and a giant firebird decal on the hood. Sometimes I drove it to school, not exactly what one would expect to see parked in the principal's parking space. The sports car took more effort until I heard Ford was going to put the Thunderbird back into production. After working with middle and high school students for 32 years I decided a new T-bird would be the ultimate retirement present. John and I went to Crouse Ford in Taneytown where my family has purchased our cars for many years. At the time there was such a demand for the car I needed to enter a lottery resulting in being placed third to receive a car. I ordered the car in 1999 and took delivery January 11, 2002.

My love of cars started with my 1960 yellow Metropolitan convertible and I wanted my thunderbird to look as much like my Met as possible. Therefore color choices were not an issue, yellow with a black top. When we picked up the car I told the dealer I was going to drive it south until I could put the top down. Being January he thought we might need to drive quite a distance. We waited until March and took it to New Bern, North Carolina and one sunny afternoon we were able to lower the top (also wearing jackets). I had purchased a special notebook to take picture of all the places the bird got to go. By the third stop I realized the Bird only goes to parking lots so I stop taking pictures of it parked at far as possible from any other car.

In 2002 John and I decided to attend our first Thunderbird convention. It was located in Watkins Glen and where we met Tom Young who was directing cars into areas for judging. While we didn't see the purpose on having a new car judged we did enjoy our conversation with Tom. He suggested we might want to check out MATC. Joining has led to many adventures and lifelong friendships. John retired in 2012 as a systems analysis working on defense contracts. Being a Floridian he finds Maryland winters much too cold and spends as much time as possible at our place in Venice Fla. While there he plays tennis, enjoys community activates and watches the boats pass on the Intercostal Waterway.

I taught middle school social studies before working as an administrator in both middle and high schools. I also worked as a consultant at the state and national level. Currently I am active in community service. RECOGNIZING A STROKE

Doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

- S * Ask the individual to SMILE.
- T * Ask the person to TALK and SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE (Coherently) (I.e. Chicken Soup)
- R * Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS...

If he or she has trouble with **ANY ONE** of these tasks, call 911 <u>immediately</u> and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

<u>NOTE</u>: Another 'sign' of a stroke is this: **Ask the person to 'stick' out his/her tongue**. If the tongue is 'crooked', if it goes to one side or the other, that is also an indication of a stroke.

A cardiologist says if everyone who gets this message sends it to 10 people; you can bet that at least one life will be saved.
